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## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**ISSUE 3: January 2022**

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### January FAQ Highlights

**Q:** For group billing, such as under 90832 TM HQ, how should the billing be divided?

**A:** Under Medicaid to Schools, School Districts bill their actual cost for covered services and receive 50% of their actual cost or 50% of the allowed rate established by the fee schedule, whichever is less. In the group setting, the cost to provide 1 unit of a covered service must be allocated across all students in the group, i.e. when the service is provided to more than one student at a time, the actual cost of services delivery must be divided by the total number of students in the group, both Medicaid and non-Medicaid.

For Example:

A provider's rate for group services is \$50 per hour.

There are 5 students in the group, and 2 of these students are Medicaid-eligible. To determine billing, complete the following steps:

Divide the provider's rate by the total number of students in the group (both Medicaid and non-Medicaid)

$\$50 / 5 \text{ students} = \$10 \text{ per student}$

Complete billing for the students who are Medicaid-eligible

$\$10 \text{ per Medicaid-eligible student or } \$20 \text{ total}$

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code for the definitions under ABA treatment in the fee schedule discussed “technicians” and it is unclear who this applies to.

Although the word “technician” is used in the description for this code, “technician” references the person who is performing the treatment, so in this case the BCBA would be the technician. Mental health and/or psychotherapy procedure codes should not be used for BCBA treatment.
