What are succulents?

- Drought tolerant plants with fleshy leaves, stems and roots that store water to use in dry conditions.



Perks in Growing Succulents

- Happy in average well drained soil
- Propagate easily
- Heat tolerant
- Low water use
- Low light adaptable

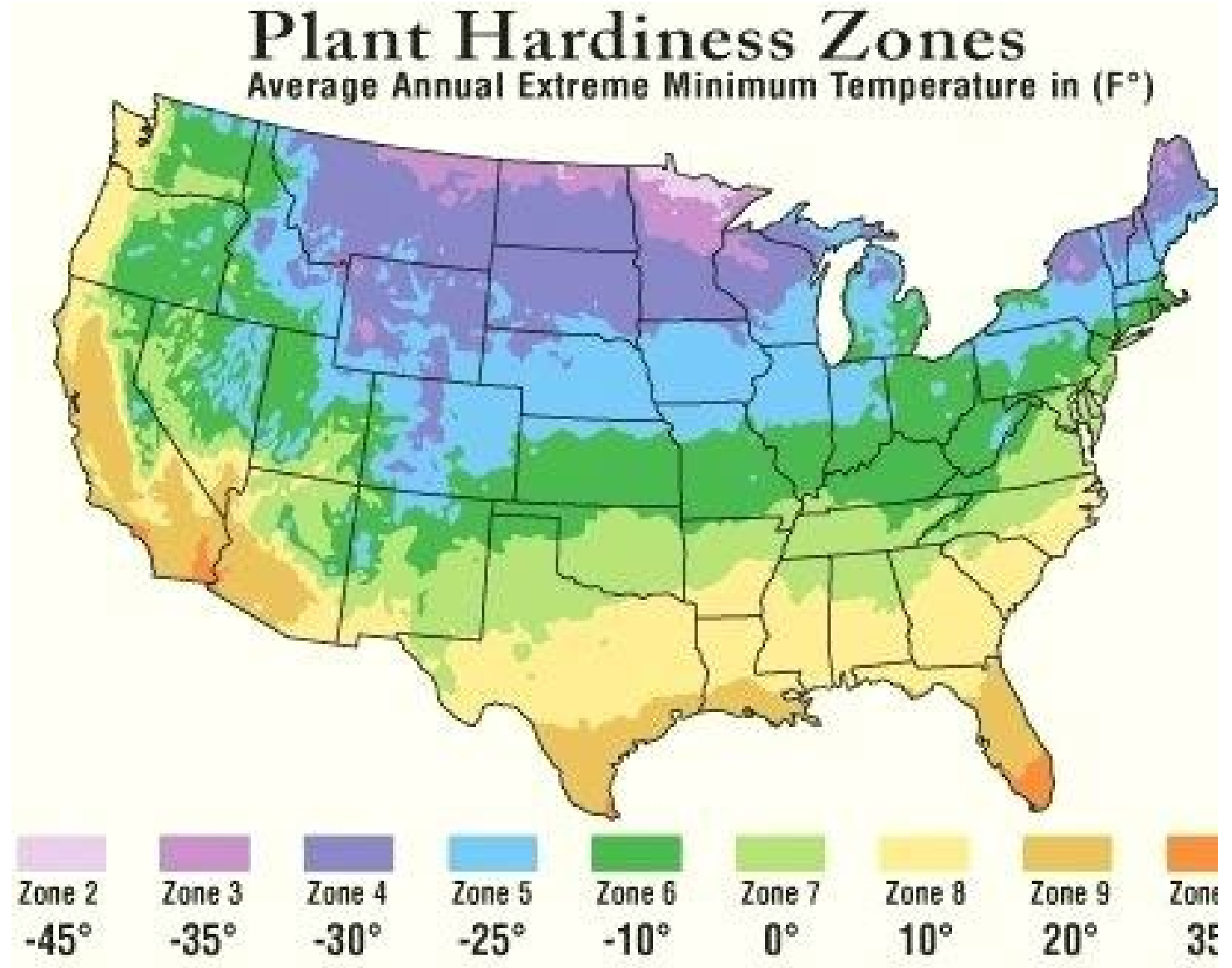


Planting Needs

- Loose, well drained soil.
 - Sandy
 - Dry
 - Small Gravel
 - Small Rocks as a mulch.
(Allows the water from rain to run down to the plants and helps soil stay moist longer.)
- Water weekly until established



Plant Hardiness Zones

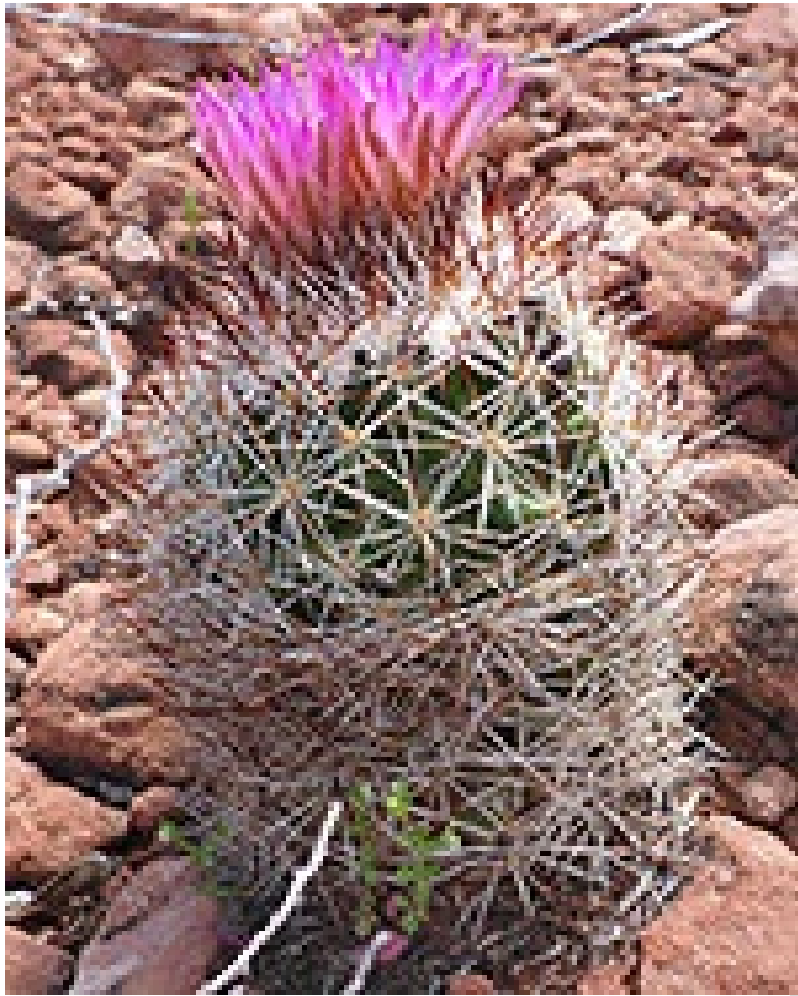
